The award commemorates a founder member Sheffield Civic Trust who sadly died in 2013 whilst an active Trustee. He had retired from a career with Sheffield City Council where he brought his skills and commitment as town planner and environmentalist to enhancing the quality of the public realm. He was also a committed and talented artist. This award was initiated in his memory and recognises an outstanding contribution to the experience of public art in Sheffield.

The award

The award is promoted by the Sheffield Civic Trust in association with the Sheffield Design Awards and the Sheffield Society of Architects. <http://www.sheffielddesignawards.org>

These awards support and recognise high quality design in the buildings, streets, places and spaces of the city We are working with the Sheffield City Council, Sheffield Visual Arts Group and the Wessex Archaeology Sheffield Public Artworks Mapping Project this year to widen our reach and ensure better coverage of the City. Two awards are made annually; one for a sculpture or relief and the other for a mural.

Criteria for entry

Sheffield – the work itself should be located within the City boundary. Whilst one of our prime aims is to support local artists, the artist does not need to be from Sheffield. We are particularly keen to get entries from outside the city centre and encourage people to discover works they might not otherwise know about.

Public – the work should be located on, or be clearly visible from, publicly accessible space. However work which is within publicly accessible buildings (schools, community buildings etc.) which may not be open 24/7 will still be considered.

Commissioned – the work should be commissioned by the land or building owner or a community group.

Artwork – the work should be original artwork but may include existing public artworks that have been relocated or conserved. The work can be sculpture, work integrated into buildings or landscape or wall art. It should not exist purely to promote or advertise a commercial enterprise or solely for political promotion (although it may contain political comment).

Completion – the work should have been created, installed, relocated or conserved between 1st June 2021- 31st May 2023. Both permanent and temporary work will be considered. Artwork may only be entered in one year, unless it has been changed significantly according to site/presentation etc.

How to enter

- Short statement on why the artwork should be considered. Max.1 side of A4
- List of consultants or clients to be credited
- High resolution image/s [no more than 4] NB Submission of these images implies permission for display at the awards ceremony and in promotional materials for the awards programme. Please provide copyright information for each image so that they are correctly credited when used.

Entries should be submitted by **Monday 18th September 2023**

Judging

The Award winner will be decided by the SCT Trustees meeting on **25th October 2023**. This decision is final.

A public presentation will be held on the evening of **16th November 2023** at a city centre location tbc. alongside the pre-launch of the Sheffield Design Awards 2024.
